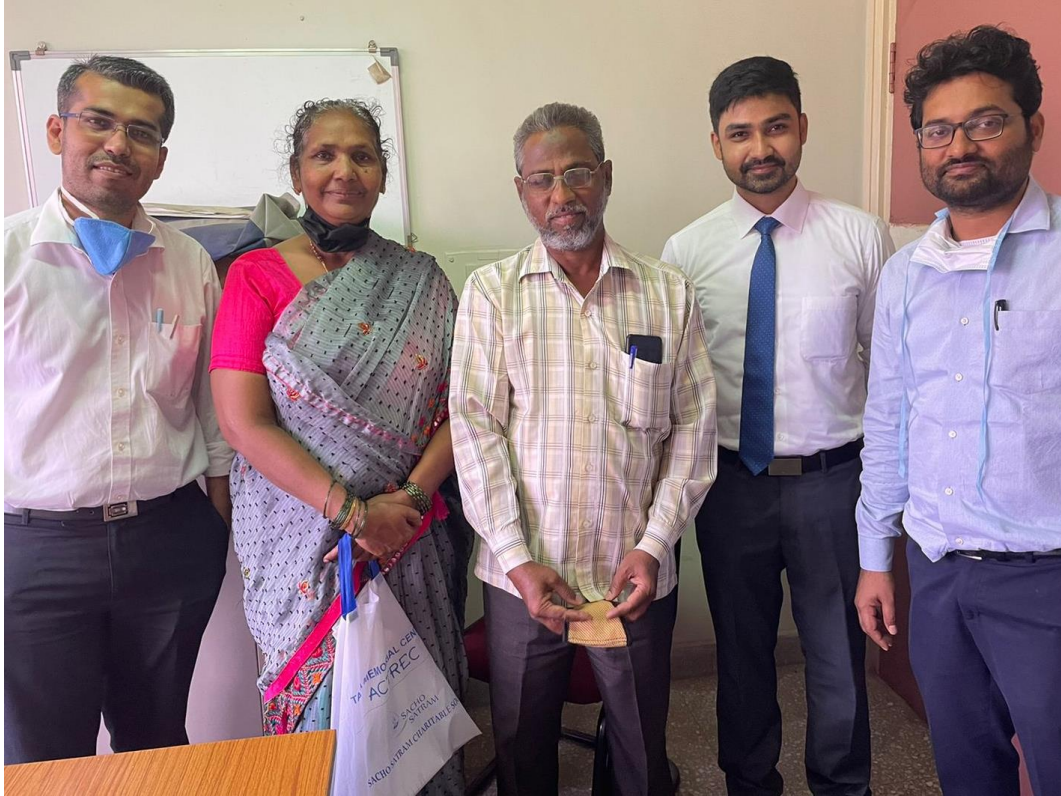


Together We Share and Learn

An MPN (PV) Case Study from India



- Name of the patient – P.P
 - Age – 65 years
 - Gender - Female
 - Location – Khargarh, near Mumbai
 - Date of Diagnosis – January 2021
 - Symptoms – Acute stomach ache
 - Occupation – Home maker

- In 2021, P. was admitted at a local hospital due to a stomach ache
 - Doctors raised concerns over her high WBC count and urged her to undergo further tests.
 - P's husband was a retired employee of BEST, the city's municipal transport company.
 - The couple could not afford the tests at out-of-pocket expense.



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- P. was transferred to Tata Memorial Hospital, Khargarh.
- A Haemograph and Bone Marrow Transplant confirmed her diagnosis with Polycythemia Vera.
- Presently, P. leads a normal life with the medicines prescribed to her.
- Her treating physician is Dr Sumeet Mirgh, Assistant Professor, Adult Haematolymphoid and BMT, Tata Memorial Centre ACTREC
- P. visits him once in three months for check-ups.
- Her husband and she live with their children in Khargarh.



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
